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## CODE OF CONDUCT FOR TEACHING STAFF

Those who choose to become teachers, take responsibility of conducting themselves upholding the standards of the profession. ## **TEACHERS SHOULD:**

- Model the highest standards of instruction and assist students in acquiring the necessary skills and knowledge.
- Cooperate and assist in carrying out functions pertaining to the educational responsibilities of the college and university as assigned by the authority.
- Fulfil their responsibilities with dedication and honesty while adhering to the professional ethics.
- Have excellent leadership qualities and serve as an exemplar for the students.
- Maintain proper communication with the parents to inform the overall progress of the student.
- Strive for professional development and stay updated with the evolving educational practices.
- Be punctual, disciplined, and not absent without prior notice to the principal.
- Respect the dignity of all the stake holders and must forbid discrimination and harassment in any form inside the college premises.
- Behave with grace, kindness, impartiality, and respect; abstain from insulting words, arguing and yelling, and acting in a disrespectful manner.



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- Ensure completion of the academic syllabus, programs, and evaluation and submission of reports within the stipulated time.
- Acknowledge the uniqueness of every student and aim to give them individualised attention.
- Initiate and coordinate curricular, extension and community outreach programs.
- Inculcate scientific inquiry and a love for nature; must promote experiential Learning, invited lectures, use of technology and ethical awareness.
- Instil the values of democracy, patriotism, national heritage, peace and communal harmony.
- Be available even beyond the working hours, if needed, for proper conduct of institutional activities without any reward.
- Comply with the terms and conditions stated in the employment contract and policies.
- Discourage any sort of academic dishonesty related to exams or other collegerelated activities.
- Respect and uphold the privacy of student data and other sensitive information.
- Utilise digital platforms to enhance teaching and learning, and avoid actions that could have adverse consequences.
- Seek prior permission from the relevant authorities to organize programmes inside the campus.
- Be rightly attired and wear the uniform and ID card, approved by the authority, inside the college premises.
