#### 5. DEPARTMENT ANTI RAGGING SQUAD

The Anti-Ragging Squad has been diligently monitoring and ensuring a safe environment within our department. Regular patrols and awareness campaigns have been conducted to prevent any instances of ragging. We remain committed to upholding a zero-tolerance policy towards ragging activities.

#### 21. PTA Meeting
